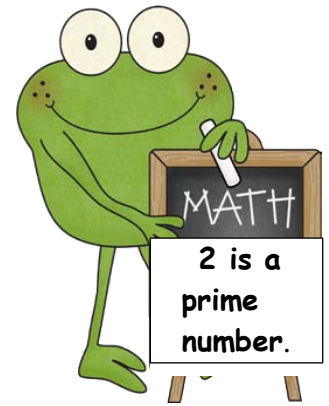

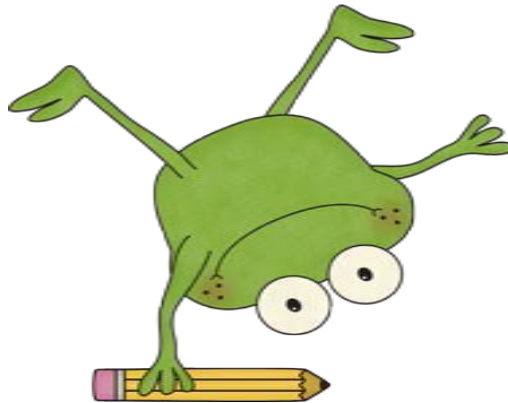
The number one has only 1 factor so
