The next few weeks in science class we will be devoting time to reviewing the scientific process in preparation for a science project that will count as a **test grade due Tuesday, March 19**th. We will be doing a small portion of the work here at school, but most of it will need to be done at home. Everyone will need a science fair (tri-fold) poster board for their presentations. I will be sending home requirements for the project in early February. This project will count as **2 test grades**. Students need to let me know what question they want to study further. The question should be testable; this is an experiment, not a project. For example: Do apples keep better in a green produce bag or on the window sill? The school science fair is set for March 21. All students are encouraged to participate. We will be spending a lot of time working on these projects and the science fair is a great place to display all of our hard work.
